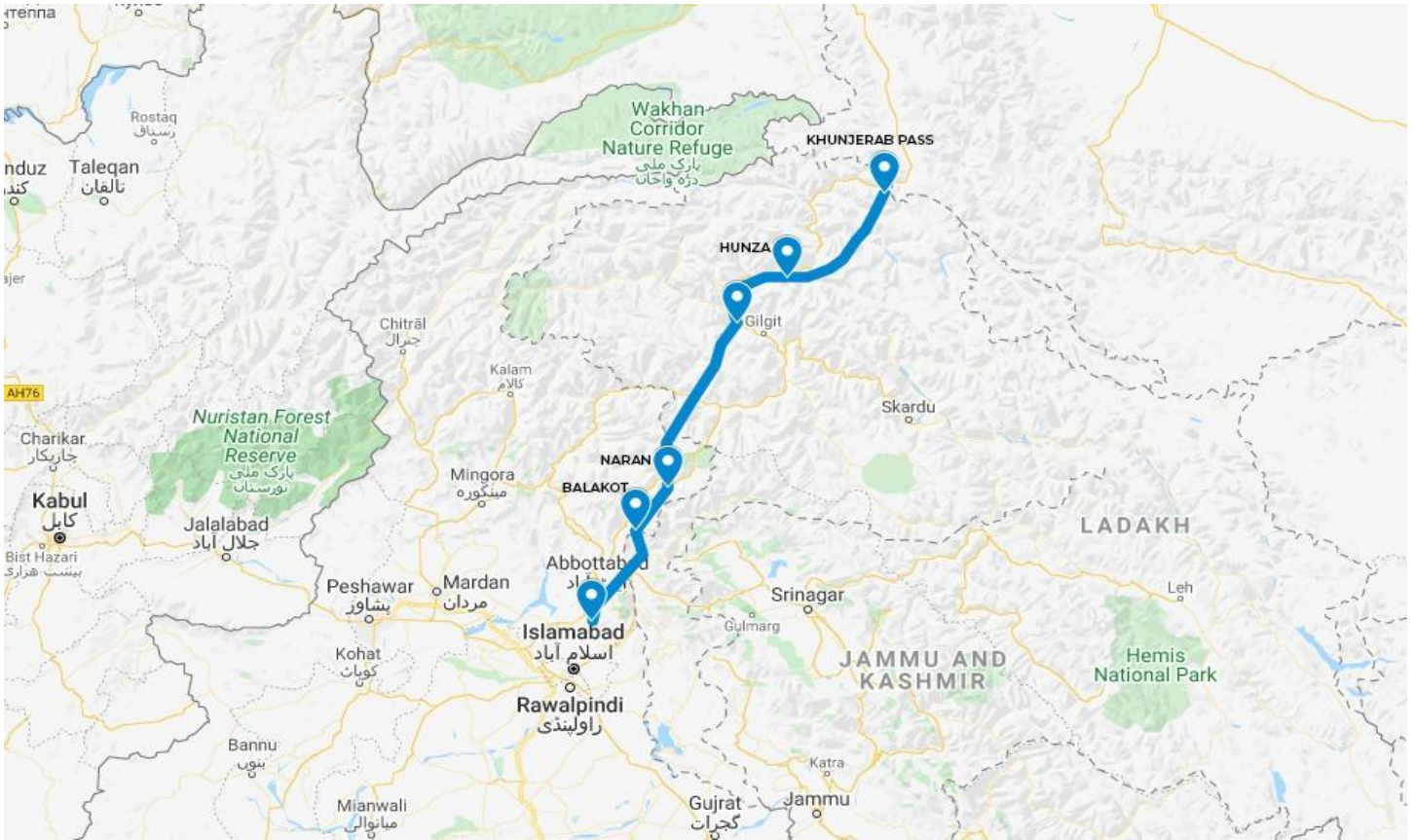

Daily Itinerary

- Day 1

Balakot is a town in Mansehra District in the Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province of Pakistan. It is located on the right bank of the Kunhar River. It is almost at two-thirds of the length of river from its origin at Lake Dharam Sar deep in the Kaghan Valley, before it confluence with Jehlum River.

Travel from Islamabad to Balakot. Overnight stay in hotel.

- Day 2

Naran is a medium-sized town in upper Kaghan Valley in Mansehra District of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province of Pakistan. It is located 119 kilometers from Mansehra city at the altitude of 2,409 meters (7,904 ft). It is located about 65 kilometer away from Babusar Top. It is a popular tourist attraction locally as well as internationally.

Jheel Saif ul Muluk is a mountainous lake located at the northern end of the Kaghan Valley, near the town of Naran in the Saiful Muluk National Park. At an elevation of 3,224 m (10,578 feet) above sea level, the lake is located above the tree line, and is one of the highest lakes in Pakistan.

Morning breakfast at hotel. Proceed to Naran. Visit Jheel Saif ul Mulook. Overnight stay in hotel.

- Day 3

Lulusar Lake is a lake at 3,410 m (11,190 ft), and is the primary headwaters of the Kunhar River. It flows southwest through the entire length of Kaghan Valley, passing Jalkhand, Naran, Kaghan, Jared, Paras and Balakot until its confluence with the Jhelum River. It is located about 50 kilometres away from Naran and is accessible by any kind of vehicle. Babusar Pass or Babusar Top is located at elevation 4,173 metres or 13,691 feet. It is a mountain pass in Pakistan at the north of the 150 km long Kaghan Valley, connecting it via the Thak Nala with Chilas on the Karakoram Highway (KKH). It is the highest point in the Babusar Valley that can be easily accessed by cars. The Babusar Pass connects Khyber Pakhtunkhwa with Gilgit Baltistan.

Morning breakfast at hotel. Short visit at Lulusar lake and Babusar top. Proceed to Gilgit. Overnight stay in hotel.

• Day 4

Rakaposhi is a mountain in the Karakoram mountain range in the Gilgit-Baltistan territory of Pakistan. It is situated in the middle of the Bagrote valley, Nagar valley and danyor, approximately 100 km north of the city of Gilgit. Rakaposhi is also known as Dumani ("Mother of Mist" or "Mother of Clouds"). It is ranked 27th highest in the world.

Altit fort is an ancient fort at Altit town in the Hunza valley in Gilgit Baltistan, Pakistan. It was originally home to the hereditary rulers of the Hunza state who carried the title Mir.

Baltit Fort is a fort in the Hunza valley, near the town of Karimabad, in the Gilgit-Baltistan region of northern Pakistan. Founded in the 8th CE, it has been on the UNESCO World Heritage Tentative list since 2004.

Morning breakfast at hotel. Proceed to Hunza. Short stay at Rakaposhi view point. Visit Altit fort and Baltit fort. After that visit Karimabad bazar. Overnight stay in hotel.

• Day 5

Khunjerab Pass is a 4,693-meter (15,397 ft)-high mountain pass in the Karakoram Mountains, in a strategic position on the northern border of Pakistan (Gilgit-Baltistan's Hunza and on the southwest border of China (Xinjiang)).

Attabad Lake is a lake located in the Gojal region of Hunza Valley in Gilgit-Baltistan, Pakistan. It was created in January 2010 as the result of a major landslide in Attabad. The lake has become one of the biggest tourist attractions in Gilgit-Baltistan, offering activities like boating, jet-skiing, fishing and other recreational activities.

The Karakoram Highway is a 1,300 km national highway which extends from Hasan Abdal in the Punjab province of Pakistan to the Khunjerab Pass in Gilgit-Baltistan, where it crosses into China and becomes China National Highway 314. The highway is a popular tourist attraction and is one of the highest paved roads in the world, passing through the Karakoram mountain range,

Morning breakfast at hotel. Proceed towards Attabad lake. Drive through Pak-China Friendship Tunnels (5.4 Kilometer Long tunnel). Short stay at Attabad lake. Enjoy beautiful sightseeing of Passu cones. Proceed to Khunjerab pass (4.5hrs drive). After visit return to Hunza. Overnight stay in hotel.

- Day 6

Eagle Nest view point is located on Duikar view point in Hunza valley, at a height of about 10000 feet above sea level accessible by jeep from Hunza it is small hotel at magnificent point where tourist visit in early morning for sunrise. The hotel has fascinating views of Rakaposhi, Ultar, Golden peak & other snowcapped mountains.

Morning breakfast at hotel. Leave for Eagle Nest view point. Enjoy some time there. Return back to hotel. Overnight stay in hotel.

- Day 7

Gilgit-Baltistan formerly known as the Northern Areas, is a region administered by Pakistan as an administrative territory, and constitutes the northern portion of the larger Kashmir region. The territory shares a border with Azad Kashmir, together with which it is referred to by the United Nations and other international organizations as "Pakistan administered Kashmir". Gilgit-Baltistan is six times the size of Azad Kashmir.

Morning breakfast at hotel. Return back to Naran via Chilas. Overnight stay in hotel.

- Day 8

Islamabad is the capital city of Pakistan, and is federally administered as part of the Islamabad Capital Territory. Islamabad is the ninth largest city in Pakistan, while the larger Islamabad–Rawalpindi metropolitan area is the country's fourth largest with a population of about 3.1 million.

Morning breakfast at hotel. Proceed to Islamabad (6.5-7hrs drive). Overnight stay in hotel.

- Day 9

The Faisal Mosque is a mosque located in Islamabad, Pakistan. It is the fifth-largest mosque in the world and the largest within South Asia, located on the foothills of Margalla Hills in Pakistan's capital city of Islamabad. The mosque features a contemporary design consisting of eight sides of concrete shell and is inspired by the design of a typical Bedouin tent.

The Pakistan Monument is a national monument and heritage museum located on the western Shakarparian Hills in Islamabad, Pakistan. The monument was constructed to symbolize the unity of the Pakistani people. It is dedicated to the people of Pakistan who

sacrificed their "today" for a better "tomorrow". Its elevation makes the monument visible from across the Islamabad-Rawalpindi metropolitan area and is a popular tourist destination.

Morning breakfast at hotel. Short tour of Islamabad (FAISAL MOSQUE, PAKISTAN MONUMENT etc). Proceed to airport, bus terminal or train station.
